

## CAPITALIZING 'I'

### What does Capitalizing 'I' Mean?

I is a special pronoun that takes the place of your own name. Your own name always begins with a capital, so when you are talking about yourself you use capital I. But you do not need a capital m when you call yourself *me*.

#### **Examples:**

- I am a girl.
- I like to eat apples.
- Dad and I are going home.
- The dog and I go for a walk.
- Give the book to me.
