What are Context Clues?

When you are reading, you will come to words you do not know. You can learn the meaning of those words by looking for the clues in the sentence around that word. The clues will help you understand the meaning of the new word even if you cannot pronounce it!

In each of the following sentences, the underlined word is not real. But you can use the clues around it to practice for times when you need to understand real words.
