

COMBINING TWO SIMPLE SENTENCES

How Can Two Simple Sentences be Combined?

Two simple sentences can be combined by using words called conjunctions to join them. Some examples of conjunctions are:

- and
- but
- or

Two simple sentences can also be combined by joining the subjects or the predicates.

Joining the subjects:

Lillian likes bananas. I like bananas. Lillian and I like bananas.

Joining the predicates:

Mary went shopping. Mary did her homework.
