### What is Drawing Conclusions?

**Drawing a conclusion** is a reasonable decision you make based on facts and details in a sentence, paragraph, story, or article.

When you draw a conclusion, you often use information you already know or have learned before.

**Example:**

Peter put on his hat, scarf, gloves, and jacket and headed outside to play.

After reading this sentence, what do you think the weather is like outside?
