When you add a suffix to a word, you many change the part of speech too.

Examples:

to please = a verb

I like to please my teachers and do well in class.

pleasure = noun

It is my pleasure to be your friend.

pleasant = adjective It is a pleasant day.



When you add a prefix or suffix to a word, you CHANGE the meaning of that word.

Examples:

I <u>like</u> to eat cherries. - means you enjoy eating cherries

I <u>dislike</u> eating cherries. - means you do NOT enjoy eating cherries
