What is An Inference?

An **inference** is a logical conclusion based on the facts written in a text. When you read, you draw inferences or make conclusions based on what you read. The conclusion may not be stated in the text, but from what the writing tells the reader, the reader infers what is meant.

You can use...

- 1. facts and details written in the text
- 2. your background knowledge: what you have learned already
- 3. what you have learned from your personal experiences

Example:
