What Is a Noun?

A noun is the **name** of a person, place, thing, or idea. A **common noun** names a **class** of people, places, things, or ideas. A **proper noun**, which is always **capitalized**, names a **particular** person, place, thing, or idea.

Examples:

- A **singular noun** names one person, place, thing, or idea, while a **plural noun** names more than one person, place, thing, or idea.
- A noun showing ownership is called a **possessive noun**.
- *Great-uncle* is an example of a **compound noun**.
- A noun that follows a *verb of being* is known as a **predicate noun**.
- A noun that names a group of people, animals, or objects is called a **collective noun**.
