

## GERUNDS, INFINITIVES, PARTICIPLES

### What is a Gerund?

A **gerund** is a **verb** that is used as a **noun**. A **gerund** is formed by adding *-ing* to the **present** form of a **verb**.

*Examples:* The **gerunds** in the following sentences are in **bold print**.

- **Studying** is mandatory before an important test.
- My father enjoys **cooking** for our family.

### What is an Infinitive?

An **infinitive** is a **verb** that is used as a **noun, adjective, or adverb**. The word *to* is known as the **sign of the infinitive**.

*Examples:* The **infinitives** in the following sentences are in **bold print**.

- **To travel** is a dream of Nana's.
- After the game, we decided **to celebrate**.

### What is a Participle?

A **participle** is a **verb** that is used as a **noun, adjective, or adverb**. The word *ing* is known as the **sign of the participle**.

*Examples:* The **participles** in the following sentences are in **bold print**.

- **Singing**, she was very happy.
- **Frightened**, she ran away.
