What is a Gerund?

A gerund is a verb that is used as a noun. A gerund is formed by adding -ing to the **present** form of a **verb**.

Examples: The **gerunds** in the following sentences are in **bold print**.

- o **Studying** is mandatory before an important test.
- o My father enjoys cooking for our family.

What is an Infinitive?

An **infinitive** is a **verb** that is used as a **noun**, **adjective**, or **adverb**. The word to is known as the **sign of the infinitive**.

Examples: The **infinitives** in the following sentences are in **bold print**.

- o To travel is a dream of Nana's.
- o After the game, we decided to celebrate.
