

MODIFIERS – ADVERBS

What is an Adverb?

A word that **modifies** a verb, an adjective, or another adverb is called an adverb. **Modify** means **to change**. Since adverbs **change** the meanings of verbs and adjectives, adverbs are also called **modifiers**.

- Adverbs answer the questions: How? When? Where? or To What Extent?
- Many adverbs end in the letters -ly.
- When **two** actions are being compared, the **comparative** form of the adverb is used.
- When **three or more** actions are being compared, the **superlative** form of the adverb is used.
- When using the comparative and the superlative form of adverbs, be careful to avoid double comparisons (e.g. use 'fastest' rather than 'most fastest').
