What are Punctuation Marks?

Punctuation marks are symbols to help readers understand how to read sentences.

Examples:

- Period-ending marks, abbreviations
- Question mark-ending marks
- Exclamation point-ending marks
- Comma-separating items or words, direct address, dates
- Semicolon-joining two parts of a compound sentence
- Colon-before a list of items, in times, after the salutation of a business letter
- Quotation marks-enclosing a direct quotation, songs, short stories, or poems
- Apostrophe-possessives, contractions
- Hyphen-word breaks, compound numbers
- Parentheses-additions to sentences
- Dash-bre
