What is Structural Analysis in Reading?

In order to derive the **meanings** of words, it is helpful to analyze the **structure** of the words in English:

- Is there a Latin or a Greek root word?
- Is the word a base word that can stand alone?
- Are there prefixes and suffixes added to the base word?
- What are the meanings of the affixes added to the base word?
- Is the word a shortened form of a longer word?

Examples:

- The word autograph came from the Greek root graph that means write.
- The word **video** came from the Latin root **vid** that means see.
- The prefix
