

## REGULAR AND IRREGULAR VERBS

## What is a Verb?

- A verb is the "action" or "being" part of the predicate of a sentence. The
  different forms of a verb are called tenses and express present, past, and
  future times. The principal parts of a verb are: the infinitive, the present
  participle, the past tense, and the past participle.
- o Regular verbs form their past tenses by adding -d or -ed to the infinitive.
- o Irregular verbs form their past tenses in a different way.

## Examples:



- 1] What is the **past** tense of this irregular verb: **eat**?
- a] eating
- b] will have eaten
- c] will eat
- d] ate
- 2] Choose the future tense of this irregular verb: swim.
- a] swimming
- bl swam
- c] will swim
- d] will have swum
- 3] What is the past participle of this irregular verb: give?
- al gave
- b] have given
- c] give
- d] gives





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
