

## READING AND WRITING WHOLE NUMBERS

### Writing Whole Numbers

Use a **comma** to separate each group of three digits.

**Examples:**

3, 107, 527

439,802

4,082

### Reading Whole Numbers

Start at the number farthest to the LEFT.

**Example:**

Millions	
	7

Seven mil  
sixty-four

undred

**Another Example:**

Millions	Hundred thousands	Ten thousands	Thousands	Hundreds	Tens	Ones
3	1	4	7	5	2	6

You read the above number:

Three million, one hundred forty-seven thousand, five hundred twenty-six

**NEVER** use the word **AND** when reading or writing a whole number.

For example:

For the number 321:

We write: 321

We read: three hundred twenty-one

We **DO NOT** read: three hundred and twenty one
