

thermometer. A thermometer tells what the temperature is by using numbers. High numbers mean hot temperatures and low numbers mean cold temperatures.

A wind vane tells what direction the wind is blowing.



A snow gauge tells how many inches of snow fell in a certain time.


The amount of water in the air is the **humidity**. When it is very humid outside usually the air feels sticky and hot.



What Are Clouds and Rain?

When water vapor (water in the air) cools \rightarrow clouds form in the sky.

Clouds are tiny drops of water together in sky. There are many different kinds of clouds.



What are Some Kinds of Bad Weather?

A **thunderstorm** is a storm that brings rain, lightning, and thunder.

Sleet is freezing rain. It starts out as rain in the sky, but starts to freeze as it falls. When it gets to the ground, it is almost frozen.





Snow is water that freezes high in the air and falls as snowflakes.

A blizzard is a lot of snow that falls in a short amount of time.



A hurricane is a dangerous storm that brings high winds and a lot of rain.
