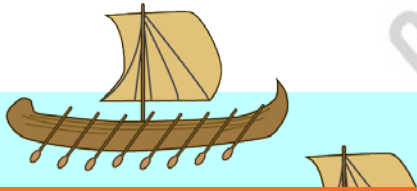


PHOENICIA: (1000-300 BC)
